

The World Affairs Council of Harrisburg




We are supported by national and local organizations and businesses that understand the importance of connecting our region to the world, and that realize the benefits of opening young minds to different cultures and traditions.



SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Our internship program blends virtual meetings with in-person trips that offer students a diverse range of opportunities. With a lineup of speakers that included local political analysts, university professors, and journalists, students were exposed to a wide variety of topics from the local to the global level.

One of the many hands-on experiences the students had during the internship was planning and hosting the annual International Young Leaders Conference. They chose to focus this year's conference on the theme "The Value of A Life" and held it at Harrisburg University.

We partnered with PennLive to provide students with a platform to publish an op-ed or letter to the editor. Their articles were also compiled in an online journal, providing a broader audience with access to their insightful perspectives.

THE STATE OF MENTAL HEALTH

As a part of our Public Health Initiative, WACH started a State of Mental Health series focused on different aspects of mental health within our region.

Race, Culture & Identity
