

SUMMER INTERNSHIP





14 College and high school students participated in Our 8-week program from June - August



Our internship program seamlessly integrates virtual meetings with inperson excursions, offering students a diverse array of opportunities. This initiative featured a lineup of speakers, including local political analysts, university professors, and journalists, exposing students to a wide range of topics spanning local and global issues.

Among the many hands-on experiences available, students were tasked with planning and hosting the annual International Young Leaders Conference. This year, they centered the conference around the theme "Can the World be Saved? Perspectives from the Next Generation," which took place at Central Penn College.

In collaboration with PennLive, we provided students with a platform to publish op-eds or letters to the editor. Their articles were subsequently compiled into an online journal, thereby extending their insightful perspectives to a broader audience.




JOHN HARRIS HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS SPONSORSHIP
